



Biography for Tim Dixon, IEAGHG

Tim Dixon is the head of IEAGHG, appointed as General Manager in June 2019. IEAGHG is an international R,D&D programme focussed on carbon capture, utilisation and storage (CCUS). Activities include technical studies, expert networks, GHGT Conferences, summer schools, and inputting evidence-base to international regulatory and policy developments. IEAGHG is funded by 36 member countries and organisations. Tim has been at IEAGHG since 2008, he was previously the Programme Manager and

Technical Programme Manager. Tim is chair of various international steering committees, including for the GHGT conferences, Offshore CCS workshop series, the Monitoring Network, and of advisory committees for several CCS projects, recent examples including GomCarb in the US and STEMM-CCS in the EU.

Outside IEAGHG, Tim is also a Director on the Board for The International CCS Knowledge Centre, Canada, an Honorary Senior Research Fellow at the Bureau of Economic Geology, University of Texas Austin, an Honorary Lecturer at the University of Edinburgh, and was an original Board Member of the UK CCS Research Centre.

Previous to IEAGHG, Tim worked for the UK Government, for AEA Technology (UK), for the Global CCS Institute (Australia) and for Curtin University (Australia). Tim has been active in UNFCCC meetings since 1999, representing CCS since 2005. He was the EU lead negotiator for CCS in the CDM at UNFCCC COP-17 (2011), and a UK negotiator for CCS in the London Convention (2004-6), in OSPAR (2006-7), the EU CCS Directive (2006-8), and the EU ETS (2006-9).

Tim has a BSc in Physics and an MBA.
